Presentations

Tina Fuller, GIS Analyst with the Ada County Sheriff's Office – Touring Ada County Dispatch Center

- Tina Fuller gave the SIG group a tour of the new Ada County Dispatch Center. She explained the processes on how all the emergency calls come into the center. Each dispatcher has about 4 to 8 computer screens. Each screen serves a purpose one with a GIS map, one to pull up background information and cameras etc. If a medical call comes into the dispatcher, one of the screens will have the medical scenario pop up on how to assess the situation. With each scenario, they follow the national standards. With police and law calls the dispatcher works off instinct. Every hour each dispatcher switches work stations and duties. Each dispatcher also goes through 6 months of training (shadowing) before they're on their own. The old Ada County Dispatch Center serves as a backup center in case of an emergency. Tina also talked about the technology at the Dispatcher Center. They use a program called TriTech to view GIS data and majority of the GIS data comes from Ada County.
